The Gardens

- **Marie-Hélène and Roch Baillot**
1095 Quigley Hill Road

This custom cut-granite home built by Dr. RJ Kennedy in 1966 is set among stately mature trees and gardens on a beautiful 9.5 acre property. Tour a natural paradise with a large pond and a stream running down a wooded ravine. The owners operate Sphere College, a specialized private high school, onsite.

- **Gabrielle Sleeth and Rick Sheppard**
931 Kevin Crescent

Rick and Gabrielle have created an urban garden that benefits birds, bats, bugs and animals. Their garden has been certified by the Canadian Wildlife Federation. The garden has a pond, perennials, fruit trees and shrubs, as well as feeders and nesting boxes. It is designed for year-round interest.

- **St Mark's Anglican Church**
2476 Old Montreal Road

Take a break to enjoy tea and homemade sweets for sale in the garden of this historic church.

- **Jim Benson**
2535 Manse Road

Escape to this private oasis that has the feel of a cottage community. Jim's beautiful terraced garden overlooks the Ottawa River, near the Cumberland ferry.

- **Catherine and Glenn Roberts**
1085 Armstrong Road

This ¾ acre property near the Ottawa River features hundreds of perennials planted in the last few years. Come see an ambitious garden in progress.

- **Kate Fawkes and Mike Ivanski**
1495 Kinsella Drive

This large country lot is designed for four-season interest with a variety of shrubs to provide a backdrop to perennials and spring bulbs.
